Math intervention, K-12, will be the next primary focus for 2016-17, with the implementation of a new curriculum. Research and evidence based behavior interventions are also a high priority.

- **Know about teacher and para-educator qualifications.** Odessa's instructors are currently all highly qualified. This is posted on the OSPI website, the district website, and in the Nov. District Newsletter.
- Read and sign the **Parent Compact** (in the student handbook) during registration prior to the start of school. Participate in revisions during fourth quarter.

Title 1-A & LAP 2019-2020



Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) provides financial assistance to states and school districts to meet the needs of educationally at-risk students. The goal of Title I is to provide extra instructional services and activities which support students identified as failing or most at risk of failing the high challenging performance standards in mathematics, reading, and writing. In our district students are served in all grades using Title 1-A and LAP funds.



What Can Title 1-A or LAP do for my Child?

Who will be served and how will they be served?

Odessa will again use the "Targeted Assistance" model, which means Title 1-A and LAP will serve the students identified as being at risk for not passing high stakes assessments or graduating on time. It will offer students

- Smaller classes or special instructional groups
- Additional teachers and aides
- Opportunities for professional development for their teachers
- Extra time for teaching students the skills they need
- Research and evidence based teaching materials and strategies
- Individualized programs for students
- Support programs and interventions are developed for students



What if my child is identified as needing Title or LAP Services?

- Upon completion of September testing, parents of students identified as possibly being at risk in math or reading, will be notified in a letter.
- Our approach is to be "proactive." We know "early intervention" is the best form of prevention and the most positive way to put children on a path to academic success.

What is the Title 1-A Compact?
